Development Issue 1-1 Strengthening the foundations of economic development	【Current Status and Issues】 Cabo Verde graduated from the list of the Least Developed Countries (LDCs) in 2007 (Heisei 19).Currently classified as a middle-income country, Cabo Verde faces several economically disadvantageous conditions, such as a narrow land area, geographical conditions of remote islands, limited rainfall, and soil deterioration that make it difficult to produce grain, as well as a lack of natural resources. Cabo Verdean government has developed the Strategic Plan for Sustainable Development 2022-2026 (PEDS2). The national development goal is to transform the country's economic structure to take advantage of its geopolitical location on the Atlantic Ocean by balancing economic development with environmental protection, reducing inequality with social inclusion, and strengthening democracy and national sovereignty.The challenge is to develop the basic infrastructure that will serve as the foundation for sustainable development.						【Policies for Addressing Development Challenges】 In order to enable the realization of a competitive economy and sustainable development, Japan will support power sector reforms, including renewable energy, and the strengthening of basic infrastructure that contributes to a stable water supply in Cabo Verde.

	【Current Status and Issues】 Cabo Verde is dependent on imports for much of its food due to geographical conditions that make grain production difficult. Tourism income, remittances from overseas migrant workers, and foreign direct investment (FDI) are the main sources of income. This makes it susceptible to European economic trends, and Cabo Verde remains vulnerable in its economic structure, with significant income inequality and a poor population living on less than US\$2.15 per day. Therefore, it is important to provide assistance that contributes to ensuring food security and correcting disparities.								【Policy for Addressing Development Challenges】 In order to realize a competitive economy and sustainable development, Japan will support Cabo Verde to reform its electricity sector, including renewable energy, and to strengthen basic infrastructure that contributes to a stable water supply, through yen loans and other means.
